Outcome

The participants were able to understand the best practices and advances in procedure, materials and tools used in verification, validation and programming of hearing aid fitting for children and adults. Ethical practices in hearing aid dispensing was discussed in a panel discussion where the following points were emphasized: displaying RCI registration in clinics, recruiting certified professionals, refrain from hearing aid fitting when there is no benefit for the patient and bridging the gap between students training and hearing aid industry. The participants were involved in small group learning in three different activities during the third day workshop: Real ear measurement, Hearing Aid Programming, Ear impression and Ear mould modification under the guidance and feedback of the resource personnel. The guidance and feedback of the resource personnel empowered the participants about the precise method and mechanism of verification validation of hearing aid fitting for different types of audiogram, Do's and don'ts of procedure for ear impression and appropriate choice of ear mould.

The topic chosen were interesting and informative and all the speakers were informative and the sessions were well organized.
