A national conference on Health Professional Education and National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 was held at Sri Ramachandra Institute of Higher Education and Research (SRIH-ER) on Saturday.

Speaking at the NAAC-sponsored conference, W. Selvamurthy, president, Amity Science, Technology and Innovation Foundation and chancellor of Amity University, Chhattisgarh, said univer-

sities should develop an ecosystem of socially relevant research to realise the fruits of the NEP.

Inaugurating the conference, M. Hanumantha Rao, executive director, All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), Madurai, said while the government spent ₹1.76 crore to produce an MBBS student at public cost, many went abroad for education.

The NEP should look at the need for rural service for these medicos who study in India, Mr. Hanumantha added.


