The day was ended with Introduction to assessments.

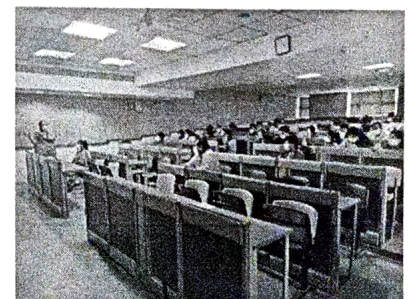
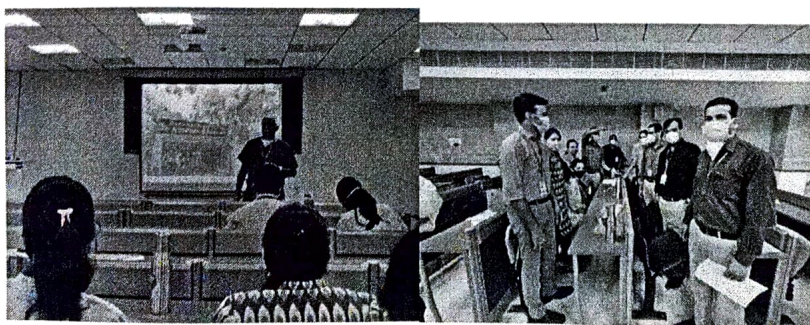
## Day 2

The program was started with re-cap session. The first session was selecting the suitable teaching methods for objectives and competencies. Interactive small group session and hands-on session for the same. The lesson plan preparation by discussing the various components to be noted when planning a teaching session. ## Day 3

The day was started with re-cap session. Hands-on session for choosing the right assessment technique for the session objective and competencies addressed. Effective way of promoting Self-directed learning (SDL) and the participants discussed the effectiveness of SDL in today's scenario. The next two sessions were Practical and clinical skill teaching and clinical and practical assessment methods. Hands-on session of how to conduct OSCE followed with lecture on educational networking. The plenary session was conducted Post-test link was shared. Participants' feedback was taken using Google forms.

There was an appreciable improvement between pretest and posttest scores of the participants. The feedback of the sessions was in the range of excellent too good in a 5 point scale.

### **Relaxation**

When you relax, you let go of worries for a while.

### **Drink less alcohol**

A lot of people find that their mental health improves when they cut alcohol out of their routine.

### **Building self-confidence**

Learning how to accept yourself and all of your unique personality traits is important to living a happy life.

### **Eat healthily**

Research shows that a diet rich in foods like fruit, vegetables and seeds helps protect your mental health.

### **Exercise and your mental health**

Regular exercise is proven to improve mental health. You will feel, sleep, and look better if you get active.

### **Make time for family and friends**

Good relationships are important for your mental health. It's worth putting effort into your friendships or making new friends.

### **Improve your mood by doing something creative**

Creative activities can help improve your mood and make you feel more confident in yourself.

1. **You have to fight when you already feel defeated**

A reporter once asked Muhammad Ali how many sit-ups he does every day. He responded, "I don't count my sit-ups, I only start counting when it starts hurting, when I feel pain, cause that's when it really matters." The same applies to success in the workplace. You always have two choices when things begin to get tough: you can either overcome an obstacle and grow in the process or let it beat you. Humans are creatures of habit. If you quit when things get tough, it gets that much easier to quit the next time. On the other hand, if you force yourself to push through a challenge, the strength begins to grow in you.

2. **You have to delay gratification**

There was a famous Stanford experiment in which an administrator left a child in a room with a marshmallow for 15 minutes. Before leaving, the experimenter told the child that she was welcome to eat it, but if she waited until he returned without eating it, she would get a second marshmallow. The children that were able to wait until the experimenter returned experienced better outcomes in life, including higher SAT scores, greater career success, and even lower body mass indexes. The point is that delay of gratification and patience are essential to success. People with mental strength know that results only materialize when you put in the time and forego instant gratification.

3. **You have to make mistakes, look like an idiot, and try again—without even flinching**

In a recent study at the College of William and Mary, researchers interviewed over 800 entrepreneurs and found that the most successful among them tend to have two critical things in common: they're terrible at imagining failure and they tend not to care what other people think of them. In other words, the most successful entrepreneurs put no time or energy into stressing about their failures as they see failure as a small and necessary step in the process of reaching their goals.

#### 4. **You have to keep your emotions in check**

Negative emotions challenge your mental strength every step of the way. While it's impossible not to feel your emotions, it's completely under your power to manage them effectively and to keep yourself in control of them. When you let your emotions overtake your ability to think clearly, it's easy to lose your resolve. A bad mood can make you lash out or stray from your chosen direction just as easily as a good mood can make you overconfident and impulsive.

#### 5. **You have to make the calls you're afraid to make**

Sometimes we have to do things we don't want to do because we know they're for the best in the long-run: fire someone, cold-call a stranger, pull an all-nighter to get the company server back up, or scrap a project and start over. It's easy to let the looming challenge paralyze you, but the most successful people know that in these moments, the best thing they can do is to get started right away. Every moment spent dreading the task subtracts time and energy from actually getting it done. People that learn to habitually make the tough calls stand out like flamingos in a flock of seagulls.

#### 6. **You have to trust your gut**

There's a fine line between trusting your gut and being impulsive.

Trusting your gut is a matter of looking at decisions from every possible angle, and when the facts don't present a clear alternative, you believe in your ability to make the right decision; you go with what looks and feels right.

#### 7. **You have to lead when no one else follows**

It's easy to set a direction and to believe in yourself when you have support, but the true test of strength is how well you maintain your resolve when nobody else believes in what you're doing. People with mental strength believe in themselves no matter what, and they stay the course until they win people over to their ways of thinking.

8. **You have to focus on the details even when it makes your mind numb**

Nothing tests your mental strength like mind-numbing details, especially when you're tired. The more people with mental strength are challenged, the more they dig in and welcome that challenge, and numbers and details are no exception to this.

9. **You have to be kind to people who are rude to you**

When people treat you poorly, it's tempting to stoop to their level and return the favor. People with mental strength don't allow others to walk all over them, but that doesn't mean they're rude to them, either. Instead, they treat rude and cruel people with the same kindness they extend to everyone else, because they don't allow another person's negativity to bring them down.

10. **You have to be accountable for your actions, no matter what**

People are far more likely to remember how you dealt with a problem than they are to recall how you created it in the first place. By holding yourself accountable, even when making excuses is an option, you show that you care about results more than your image or ego.

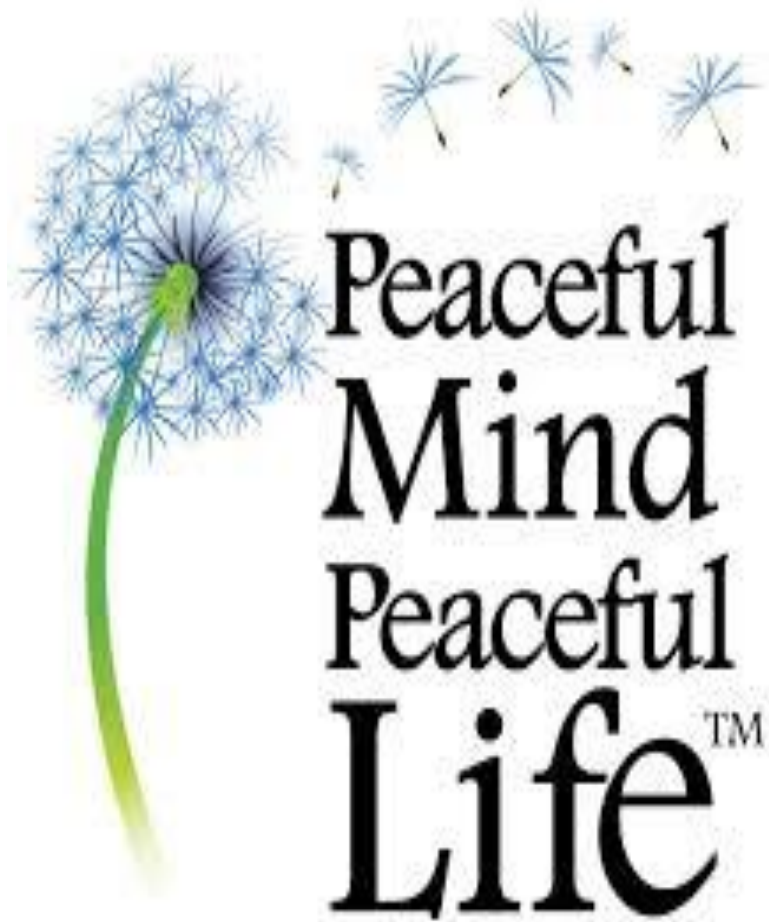

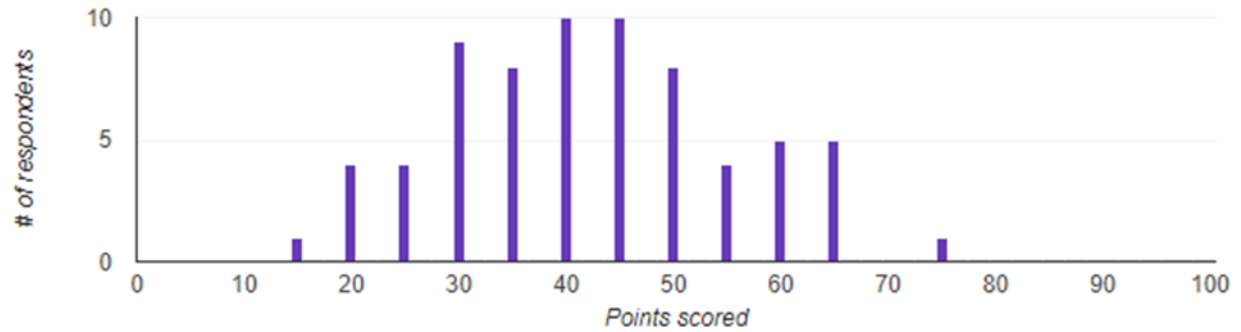

Total points distribution



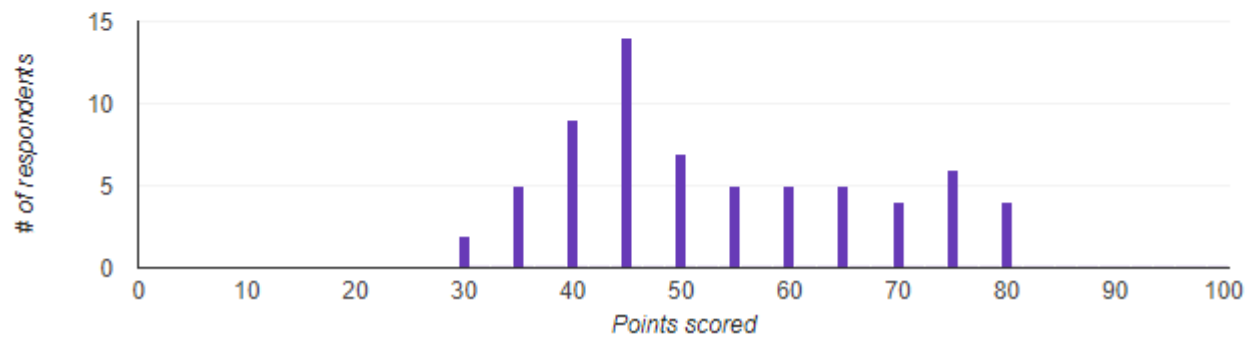

# 1. Course Overview

## Introduction

The incidence of fungal infections and their invasiveness has increased recently due to several underlying factors like rise in the immunocompromised states, greater use of broad spectrum antimicrobial agents etc. Such invasive nature of the fungi can lead to increased morbidity and mortality. Also there is an up rise in newer fungi causing infections in the recent years, which contributes to the delay in the diagnosis. This may be due to lack of awareness among the physicians and the clinical microbiologist about their causative role in fungal infections. There is also a change in trend in the antifungal susceptibility pattern among the commonly isolated fungi. Despite the huge burden and high mortality rates, fungal infections remain understudied compared with other infectious diseases and there is a pressing need for more research in this field. Hence this course was mainly designed to fill the lacunae and meet the need of the students in the field of Mycology and provoke their interest in research. This course mainly aims to provide a wide knowledge about the fungal infections along with their rapid methods of diagnosis and their antifungal susceptibility patterns.

**Aim:** The aim of the fellowship program in Medical Mycology is to provide basic and advanced training in the field of Mycology to enable the medical graduates and postgraduates to set up their own laboratory for fungal diagnostics and research.

**Goals:** Medical Mycology Fellowship program will provide training in diagnostic mycology, teaching and research. Upon completion, the trainee will have acquired the knowledge and Technical skills to diagnose fungal infections and understand the principles and practice of evidence based- Mycology.

## Objectives:

### Knowledge

At the end of the training programme the student should be able

- To describe the morphological features of fungi, classification, fungal reproduction, growth & nutrition
- To discuss the different direct microscopic techniques, fungal stains and culture media for the identification of fungi and choose the appropriate culture media for fungal culture and storage.

- To enumerate the etiological agents causing superficial, subcutaneous, systemic and opportunistic fungal infection and discuss in detail about their aetiology, pathogenesis, laboratory diagnosis and treatment.
- To list the causative fungi based on syndromic approach (Oculomycosis, Otomycosis, Hyalohyphomycosis, Fungal sinusitis, Onychomycosis, Allergic fungal diseases, Mycotoxicosis, Adiaspiromycosis, Pythiosis, Protothecosis, CNS infections etc.,) and discuss the pathogenesis, laboratory diagnosis and treatment.
- To discuss the principle and applications of molecular methods that are available for the diagnosis of fungi
- To classify the antifungal agents and discuss in detail about the mechanism of action, indications & contraindications, antifungal resistance mechanisms, *In vitro* antifungal susceptibility testing methods

### **Skill**

At the end of the training programme the student should be able

- To prepare and perform various staining techniques ( KOH mount, Lactophenol cotton blue mount, India Ink preparation, Nigrosin stain, Calcofluor white stain, Diazonium blue B stain, Haematoxylin & Eosin stain, Periodic acid- Schiff stain, Giemsa stain, Grocott-Gomori's methenamine silver stain, Mayer's Mucicarmine stain, etc.)
- To prepare and choose appropriate medium (basal and special medium) for identification of fungi.
- To perform and interpret routine mycological techniques – sugar assimilation and fermentation techniques, Germ tube test, Hair perforation test, Hair bait technique, fungal slide culture, Dalmau technique, water culture, banana peel culture, cryptococcal latex agglutination test, Galactomannan assay, etc.
- To perform and demonstrate the virulence factors of yeast and moulds (Biofilm formation- Test tube method, MTT assay, Esterase, Proteinase, Phospholipase, Haemolytic activity).
- To perform and report molecular techniques for fungal identification - ITS1 & ITS4 PCR, PCR- RFLP, IGS1 PCR, *Trichosporon* genus specific & *Trichosporon asahii* specific PCR, RAPD.

- To perform antifungal susceptibility techniques and interpret the susceptibility pattern and/ or MIC values for yeast and mould using appropriate methods (Disc diffusion, broth microdilution method & E test as per CLSI guidelines).

### **Attitude**

- Demonstrate an enthusiastic and positive approach to learning
- Show good communication skills and the capacity to liaise
- Make oral presentations to specialist and non-specialist academic audiences participating effectively within such contexts
- Approach their own professional development through planning, monitoring, critical reflection and evaluation.
- Manage time effectively and prioritise tasks appropriately whilst working independently or as part of a team.

# **FELLOWSHIP PROGRAMME IN PERINATAL PATHOLOGY**

## **SRI RAMACHANDRA MEDICAL CENTRE**

### **INTRODUCTION:**

The Perinatal Pathology Unit under the Department of Pathology, has been functioning for the past ten years. It is well equipped with a specially designed autopsy table, appropriate instruments and weighing scales required for fetal autopsies. It is also equipped with reporting software for proper workflow, easy archiving. The Perinatal Pathology Unit has performed over 1,000 fetal autopsies in the past five years. The cases include anomalies of all systems including Cardiac, Skeletal, Respiratory, Renal and Central Nervous system.

The Departments of Pathology, Obstetrics and Gynaecology, Neonatology, Genetics and Fetal Medicine are actively involved in creating a multidisciplinary approach towards each case with regular monthly Perinatal Pathology meets. These meets are attended by faculty from all the above departments to discuss cases of importance with an insight regarding the further counselling of the parents after the autopsy report.

**What is the need for Perinatal Pathology in India?** The incidence of congenital anomalies has been found to be on the rise which may partly be attributed to the emergence of the subspeciality of Fetal Medicine (with or without invasive procedures). The increasing public awareness through the Internet and the media also maybe a cause.

Fetal medicine has been recognized as a subspeciality at many centres with fellowship courses and Anomaly scans have gained prime importance for the parents during a pregnancy. This has led to detection of lethal congenital anomalies at an early gestational age providing an option of termination to the parents. The next important question from the parents is “will the same anomaly arise in our next baby too?” This is where our role as a perinatal pathologist assumes importance to predict the recurrence risk with the findings on Autopsy. The same will reflect on the quality of life of the neonates and their parents.

**Routine Diagnostic Histopathology training** does not include Fetal and Perinatal Pathology as a regular component. So the need for specialised training

in this field. The unit is staffed by a trained Perinatal pathologist and two assistants.

**AIM OF THE COURSE:**

- To acquire specialized knowledge in all aspects of Perinatal Pathology and Placental Pathology.
- To acquire training in clinical, technical, diagnostic and theoretical knowledge of fetal autopsies and placental pathology.

**Objectives of the course:**

1. To understand the basic procedure of fetal autopsy.
2. To develop expertise on the different methods of fetal autopsy.
3. To study and correlate the placental findings
4. To develop an integrated approach towards formulating a complete autopsy report involving the other disciplines of fetal medicine
5. To identify anomalies and understand counselling, need for invasive testing and protocols of care of the anomalous and non anomalous fetus
6. To understand the basics of genetic counselling.

**Number of seats:** 2 per academic year



## **REGULATIONS FOR FELLOWSHIP PROGRAMME IN PERINATAL PATHOLOGY**

### ***ELIGIBILITY***

*Candidate for admission to the Fellowship Program in Perinatal Pathology shall be required to possess the following qualifications:*

- (a) He/she must have qualified for the M.D. Pathology from any recognized institution of this University or of any other University recognised as equivalent there to by the authority of this University and the Medical Council of India and obtained permanent registration from any of the State Medical Councils.
- (b) The admitting authorities of the Medical center will strictly ensure that every candidate admitted to the Fellowship Programme in Perinatal Pathology has obtained permanent registration certificate from any one of the State Medical Councils.

### **REGISTRATION**

A candidate admitted to Fellowship Programme in Perinatal Pathology of Sri Ramachandra Medical Centre, Porur, Chennai-600116, shall register his/her name with the Medical Centre by remitting the prescribed fees along with the application for registration duly filled in and forwarded to the Medical Director.

### ***DURATION OF THE COURSE***

- (a) The period of certified study and training for the Fellowship Programme in Perinatal Pathology shall be six months for the award of Fellowship certificate.
- (b) No exemption shall be given from the period of study and training.

### ***ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENT FOR ADMISSION TO EXAMINATION***

No candidate shall be permitted to appear for the Examination unless he/she puts in 90% attendance during his/her period of study and training and produces the necessary certificate of study, attendance and progress from the Course Director.

## ***CONDONATION OF LACK OF ATTENDANCE***

There shall be no condonation of lack of attendance for Fellowship Programme students.

## ***TRAINING IN OUTSIDE CENTRES***

The Head of the Department shall make necessary arrangements for the fellowship candidates to undergo training for elective postings in other centres within the State, not exceeding a total period of two weeks.

## **NUMBER OF APPEARANCES**

A candidate registered for the Fellowship Programme in Perinatal Pathology must qualify in the examinations within three consequent attempts from the date of his/her admission, failing which he/she shall be discharged from the course.

## ***MAINTENANCE OF LOG BOOK***

1. Every Fellow shall maintain a record of skills he/she has acquired during the six months training period certified by the Head of Department under whom he/she has undergone training.
2. The Fellow should also be required to participate in the teaching and training programme of postgraduate students.
3. In addition, the Head of the Department shall involve their Fellows in Seminars, Journal Club, Group Discussions and participation in Clinical, Clinico-Pathological conferences.
4. Every Fellow should be encouraged to present short title papers in conferences and to make improvements on it and submit them for publication in reputed medical journals.
5. The Head of the Departments shall scrutinise the logbook once in every three months.
6. At the end of the course, the candidate should summarise the contents and get the logbook certified by the Head of the Department.
7. The logbook should be submitted at the time of clinical/practical examination for the scrutiny of the Board of Examiners.

## **Award of Certificate**

Certificate will be awarded duly signed by Head of the Department & Medical Director of Sri Ramachandra Medical Centre. This programme does not come under the purview of MCI and is not an additional registerable qualification.
